New this Fall... Nowashe

The Friends of Wood Memorial Library & Museum has embarked on an extraordinary project – the construction of an outdoor Indigenous People's living history museum named Nowashe, a native term which means "Between two Rivers". Located behind the library on historical Main Street, South Windsor, this dynamic, educational and interactive exhibit portrays the life-ways of the Podunk tribe, the indigenous peoples who once called this land home.

Visitors meander down a wooded path, where they come upon a partially constructed wetu showing how red cedar saplings and bark were used to construct dwellings. Patrons continue on past a three sisters' garden of corn, beans and squash to emerge upon the main area of an Indigenous Peoples village

consisting of a completed wetu

and a larger Sachem's house.

South Windsor third graders coming for their fall field trip this year will be treated to the new immersive learning stations of Nowashe, focusing on the everyday life experiences of the Podunk, such as indigenous foods and cooking, and a how the tools of the time were used to make needed objects.

We will be hosting two events this fall to introduce the public to Nowashe. The first, the 6th Annual Harvest Moon Fundraising Dinner this year will be a one-night-only exclusive preview event called "Experience Nowashe". On Saturday, September 21, 2019, the magical atmosphere that is Nowashe will be combined with seasonally inspired fare, spirits, live music and learning to create a unique and memorable evening that does not come along every day. Tickets to "Experience Nowashe" are \$125 per person and the proceeds go to support future educational programming at the site.

The second event will be a Grand Opening "Open House" event in support of Heritage Day on Saturday, October 5, 2019 from 9am – 4pm. Docents will be on hand to give tours and answer questions about

Nowashe. Demonstrations by indigenous professionals such as cooking and jewelry making will be scattered throughout

Nowashe village. This event is FREE and open to the public.

We are excited to be partnering with Cynde Acanto of the Book Club Bookstore on the Go once again, this time to add author events and book clubs to our program offerings!


