in The Vermonter magazine from February through July 1945. These letters were written while she was on duty with the United States Army Nurse Corp in France during World War II

to family members from October 1944 to May 1945.

Biographical Note

Lieutenant Joyce B. Clapp served in the United States Army Nurse Corps in France during World War II. Joyce Clapp was an East Windsor Hill (a section of South Windsor, CT) native. Her letters indicate that she may have been employed as a nurse at Colt's Factory in Hartford prior to the war, and that she grew up on a farm in East Windsor Hill. She also mentions the Hartford Circus Fire and there is reference that she rendered aid to two children, later referred to as Jane and Marty.

With regards to her family she mentions Thanksgiving at Grandma Barber's (potentially then her maternal grandmother), and writes letters to or mentions family members by the names of

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Meg (Margaret), Alice (a sister), Terry Charles (a cousin) and Clara. She also mentions Talcott, Charles and Edna but it is not clear what her relationship is to them.

Also of note is that she was treated by a dentist from Rutland, VT by the name of Captain Coolidge.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains a series of letters published in The Vermonter magazine from February through July 1945. They were written by Lieutenant Joyce B. Clapp of the United States Army Nurse Corps while on duty in France during World War II. The letters were written to family members from October 1944 to May 1945 and provide information of some of her daily and social activities, her female army co-workers, and her thoughts and feelings about the war and France.

Joyce Clapp was an East Windsor Hill natve. Her letters indicate that she may have been employed as a nurse at the Colt factory in Hartford prior to the war.
