resident who documented town events occurring n South Windsor, CT, during 1985-1995, including the Wapping Fair, South Windsor 150th birthday, Strawberry Festival, parades and picnics, and other civic events. ### **Biographical / Historical**

Romeo J. Richard (1915-2011) was born in Sanford, ME, on March 6, 1915. His parents were of French Canadian descent. His father moved to New Hampshire to work as a shipbuilder, building war boats out of wood. In 1917, the US government discovered that his father was a Canadian and sent him and his family home for him to sign up for the draft. The Canadian government found out that his father had worked on a farm and sent his father and his family to Calgary in the province of Alberta to be a farmer. Romeo Richard spent his young years

growing up working on a farm. After the war, his family moved to Montreal, Canada, where he was educated.

In 1932, he graduated from Superior School (high school). He then returned to the United States and moved to Biddeford, Maine where he worked pouring cast iron in foundaries. In 1937, he moved to Willimantic, CT, working there as a mason for approximately one year. In 1938, he moved to Hartford, CT. After completing an apprenticeship, he worked as a master tool and die maker for Pratt & Whitney Aircraft, retiring in 1977. During that time, he also worked part time in many smaller shops as well. In 1956, Mr. Richard moved to South Windsor.

On May 2, 1941, Richard was married to Marie Paradis at Saint Ann Church in Hartford, CT. Romeo and Marie Richard have had three sons and a daughter in their fifty-nine years together. Their children; names are Raymond, Benoit, Fred, and Linda.

He was a member of numerous organizations including the Knights of Columbus, National Rifle Association, and Founding President of the Super Sixty Sportsman Club of South Windsor. He was also a member of the South Windsor Senior Citizens Club, Rotary Club of South Windsor; which awarded him the Paul Harris Fellow, as well as a communicant and usher for 45-years at St. Margaret Mary Church in South Windsor. He was an avid outdoorsman who enjoyed hunting and fishing. He enjoyed photography and captured many town activities, anniversaries, celebrations, and parades.

Richard died on July 29, 2011.
