The Mulligan family owned a farm in South Windsor, CT, including the house at 707 Nevers Road, since approximately the time of the Civil War. Peter Carney married Roseanna Mulligan and acquired the farm shortly before World War I. After Peter Carney, the farm was owned by his son, Arthur Carney, Sr.

The Mulligan-Carney Family Collection consists of four accounts ledgers and related enclosures belonging to James Mulligan and Peter Carney, related to land in South Windsor that the Mulligans and later Carneys owned.

Contains dated expenditures related to Mulligan's personal/home life and farm. This book is missing its cover, but on the first page it says, "This book bought November 15, 1896. James Mulligan, Windsorville, Connecticut." It lists such things as "potatoes sold," payments to "hired help," income from tobacco sales, payments to John Mulligan, etc.

Contains dated expenditures related to Mulligan's personal/home life and farm. This book has a brown cloth cover. It includes dated expenditures and income, including under such headings as "tobacco money," "paid insurance on house & barn & contents, 18.00," "farm help."

Contains enclosures from this ledger, including a fire insurance certificate made out to James Mulligan and dated 1879 Sep 15; a signed receipt for tobacco purchased from James Mulligan at 17 1/2 cents per pound, dated 1912 Aug 30; and three loose pages of figures.

Contains dated expenditures related to Mulligan and Carney's personal/home life and farm. This book has a yellow cloth cover. The heading at the top of most of the pages is "Time Book for the Month of ____ 19__" and most of the entries appear to be wages paid. Other calculations and expenditures are also included.

Contains enclosures from this ledger, including a bill, made out to James Mulligan, from the Broad Brook Lumber & Coal Co., dated 1905 Aug 17; a statement from S.A. Fassler & Co. of Hartford, CT, dealers and packers of tobacco, made out to Peter Carney and dated 1929 Dec 14; a statement from Olds & Whipple, Inc. of Hartford, CT, dated 1929; a school fund bill for Peter Carney of Broad Brook, dated 1930 Sep 2; a certificate from 1930 Sep 22 from the town of South Windsor certifying that Peter Carney was a register bee keeper; and two empty envelopes for the Department of Motor Vehicles, State Capitol, Hartford, CT.
