Bonnie was a writer, photographer, and collage artist. She was elected poet laureate of South Windsor and published in numerous anthologies and magazines.

Bonnie married Fred Andreoli in 1962. They raised two children and divorced in 1994.

Bonnie passed away on September 8, 2016.
